NOTING that 2014 is the bicentennial year of the coming of the CMS missionary, The Reverend Samuel Marsden, at the invitation of the Maori chief Ruatara, to Ruatara's marae at Oihi, Bay of Islands.

AND further noting that on Christmas Day 1814 at Oihi the Reverend Samuel Marsden first proclaimed the Christian Gospel in Aotearoa/New Zealand.

AND noting also that those events paved the way for the proclamation of the Good News throughout the nation, as well as being the foundation of an enduring partnership between Maori and settler.

NOW THEREFORE:

- Commends to this Diocese the development of appropriate commemorative events on an ecumenical and community-wide basis throughout the nation throughout 2014.
- 2. Endorses the work of the Marsden Cross Trust Board in its project to build a Pilgrimage Path with Interpretative Centre and Gathering Place on the 20 hectares of land at Oihi acquired by the Board in 2005.
- 3. Encourages each Ministry Unit to commit to raising a share of the \$30,000 required by this Diocese to complete the land purchase at Oihi.
- 4. Encourages each Ministry Unit to create a small group to be the focus of 2014 commemorative events in this Diocese. CARRIED

BILL NO 1

THE ARCHDEACONRY AMENDMENT BILL 2012

The Synod of the Diocese of Waikato and Taranaki enacts as follows -

1. TITLE

This Statute is the Archdeaconry Amendment Statute 2012.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Statute is to make provision for a Deed of Appointment for Archdeacons.

3. COMMENCEMENT

This Statute shall come into force at the close of the Synod at which it is enacted.

4. <u>AMENDMENT OF CLAUSE 6</u>

The Statute is amended by adding a new sub clause (3) to Clause 6 as follows:

(3) The appointment of an Archdeacon under this Statute shall be recorded in a Deed of Appointment as set out in the Schedule to this Statute or to the like effect.

DIOCESE OF WAIKATO AND TARANAKI

BILL NO 2

THE HONORARY TITLES AND AWARDS BILL 2012

The Synod of the Diocese of Waikato and Taranaki enacts as follows –

1. TITLE

This Statute is The Honorary Titles and Awards Statute 2012.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Statute is to make provision for the conferring of honorary titles and awards and to recognise titles already conferred.

3. COMMENCEMENT

This Statute shall come into force at the conclusion of the Synod at which it is enacted.

4. THE TITLE "EMERITUS"

- (1) The Bishops shall have the discretion to confer the title "Emeritus" upon the retirement of any person who has held a position which required a Bishops' Licence or to whom a Ministry Certificate was issued by a parish under The Lay Ministry Licences Statute 2011.
- (2) The conferring of the title "Emeritus" shall be recorded in the Diocesan Registers as an Act of the Bishops but shall not imply or confer any right to continue to act in the position from which the holder has retired.

5. DEED OF RECOGNITION

The Bishops may authorise the issue of a Deed of Recognition to any person who has, in their opinion, given meritorious service to -

- (a) any parish in the Diocese, or
- (b) the Diocese, or
- (c) the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia, or
- (d) the Anglican Communion.

6. TITLES AND AWARDS ALREADY CONFERRED

Where a title has been conferred prior to the commencement of this Statute, the recipient may continue to use the title as if it had been conferred after the enactment of this Statute but in all other respects, the provisions of this Statute shall apply.
